# SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Last day of the workweek for this team of swing shift officers. Calls for service kept the officers busy throughout the shift. Officers responded to a dangerous driver call, where the reporting party stated her heavily intoxicated boyfriend had driven away from their

residence. The suspect was located shortly after, and it was determined that he had operated a vehicle while under the influence of alcohol. The suspect performed field sobriety tests, which he failed. He also provided a breath sample, which indicated his blood alcohol content was three times the legal limit. Through their investigation, officers also learned that the suspect had operated his vehicle with his children present while he was intoxicated. The suspect was ultimately arrested and booked for driving while intoxicated and juvenile abuse.
