SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

This Friday was a busy shift for the swingshift officers. Officers were busy throughout the entire shift with calls for service. During the night, officers responded to a weapon violation involving a juvenile who brandished a knife at a group of other juveniles. Somewhere during this incident, a mother of one of the "victim" juveniles appeared with pepper spray and somehow sprayed everyone. The offending juvenile who brandished the knife was arrested and released to his guardian. Officers also rescued a small dog who was left in a vehicle. Apparently, this was the second time that the dog owner was in violation of leaving her dog in a car. She never showed up while officers were present, and the dog was removed from

the vehicle and taken to animal control. A report will be forwarded to the District Attorney's Officer for prosecution. Officers also investigated a collision between a city bus, with passengers, and a small compact car. No injuries were reported.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Despite a low number of calls for service, officers remained busy with proactive policing. Officers located a suspect known to have a felony warrant and effected an arrest. Officers attempted to stop a speeding vehicle, and short pursuit ensued. The pursuit was safely brought to a termination point and the suspect was taken into custody. Another officer, while extra patrolling an apartment complex, located an occupied vehicle he recognized as stolen. The driver was arrested for possession of the vehicle and the passenger for a felony warrant.
