The morning began with an officer contacting a male sleeping under a blanket blocking a sidewalk, with a shopping cart and his property in the roadway. Officers responded to multiple mental health related calls today. One call was at a homeless shelter resulting in a female being detained and transported to the hospital. His mother believed police contact would cause him to run away, so in order to not agitate him more, we did not contact him. This afternoon, a female was caught shoplifting and had a felony warrant for her arrest. She was booked.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Saturday night was another typical shift. Being a weekend, officers responded to several disturbance calls, and spent a large quantity of time in the downtown area when not responding to calls for service. We also have several car meets in town, with several calls for noise complaints. In one instance, officers contacted a group of subject who were blasting music from their vehicle while it was parked downtown. Two citations were issued, with the recipient of one of the cites refusing to sign the citation. He was told of the repercussions of not signing the citation. He demanded a supervisor, and still refused to sign the citation. He was arrested and taken to jail. Later in the shift, officers contacted a subject who was calling 911 from a local park. Upon contact, he was found to have a warrant. He was also arrested and taken to jail. And finally, a subject was contacted after he was seen lighting a trash can on fire, and then seen throwing burning ashes onto a wooden shingle roof of a nearby residence. He was arrested for arson and taken to jail as well.
