SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

The shift began with a call of a driver under the influence of drugs. The driver was in a big rig with a 40-foot trailer and had stopped at a business in Turlock to make a delivery. Thankfully, the business called us to investigate before he hurt or killed someone. He was

observed making several U-turns and having a difficult time backing the trailer into a loading dock which is normally easy to maneuver. The investigation resulted in the driver being arrested for DUI (drugs). He also had fentanyl in his truck with burnt foil consistent with him using drugs in the truck. He refused a blood draw so a search warrant was authored and approved. He was transported to the hospital for a forced blood draw, and then booked in jail for DUI and possession of fentanyl. Officers responded to two public intoxication calls. One was a female on drugs inside a business who could barely stand. She went to jail to sober up. The other was a male who was drunk and threatening customers at a business. He was also going to be booked to sober up. However, on the way to jail, he proceeded to threaten to physically harm and kill the officer with language not appropriate for this log. He got himself an additional felony charge for threatening an officer.
