SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Busy shift throughout the night. Officers investigated a domestic violence incident where a male was arrested for assaulted his ex-girlfriend. He was booked into jail. Officers stopped a bicyclist for observed violations and learned he is on Post Release Community Supervision. During a search of his person narcotics and paraphernalia was located. He was arrested and issued a citation. Officers stopped a vehicle for observed violations. During the contact a DUI investigation was initiated. Based on the investigation the driver was arrested for DUI related charges. Officers contacted a suspicious vehicle and the two occupants. During the contact it was learned that one of the subjects is restrained from the other in a no contact domestic violence restraining order. The restrained subject was arrested and booked into jail. During the shift officers also responded to a suicide attempt with obvious injuries. Upon arrival officers administered aid until AMR and TFD arrived on scene. The subject was transported to an area hospital for treatment and evaluation.
