SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

The morning started off being busy, with officers responding for an unknown death. The decedent was found by her adult son, unresponsive. No signs of foul play were seen and the death seems to be of natural causes. Officers then responded to an assault and battery between a couple. On this incident, both were arrested for domestic violence related crimes, one being a felony and the other a misdemeanor. Both were taken to jail. Officers stayed busy for most of the remainder of the day, with responses to suicidal subjects, an out of control juvenile who was throwing furniture around his room, and a warrant arrest.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Swing shift was steady all evening. It began with an investigation of a deceased person at an apartment, which appeared to be from natural causes. This tied up an officer for a couple

hours investigating and waiting for the coroner. Officers responded to a few domestic disputes, a few traffic collisions and a missing 8-year-old. The child was located by his father as we were arriving to search for him. There was a car meet in the parking lot of Tilly's this evening. Officers monitored it and made a few traffic stops. One of the traffic stops was on a corvette speeding away from the car meet. The driver had a warrant out of Modesto PD for resisting arrest, so he was given a ride to jail to take care of the warrant.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Officers responded to a domestic battery between a husband and wife after the wife called to report that her husband slapped her during an argument, causing injury. The male left in a vehicle before police arrived. The wife advised officers there was a tracker on the vehicle and told the officers where the vehicle was showing parked. Officers located the vehicle at a trailer park in the driveway of a residence. Officers later responded to the male's location and arrested him for the battery.
