The dayshift officers were once again busy throughout the day. Officers started off the day by making an arrest for a weapon violation. Officers responded to a gas station for a report of a subject who was passed out, and in the driver's seat, of a sedan. When officers arrived, they located the subject at a gas pump. He had a glass pipe in his hand for ingestion of narcotics. He was removed from the vehicle and detained. A search was conducted and they located pepper spray on his person. He had been convicted of a felony and was prohibited from buying or possession of pepper spray. Additionally, he had an outstanding warrant. The subject was arrested and taken to jail. Later in the shift, officers responded to a family disturbance in the south east area of town. After their investigation of what occurred, the found that the adult son had thrown a glass at a wall, shattering it. He also stated that he wanted to kill his mother. She was in great fear for her safety. The adult son was arrested and taken to jail. During the course of the day, officers arrested 3 different subjects for outstanding warrants.

It was a pleasant evening for the most part. Two juveniles were detained for mental health evaluations. An officer stopped a male he recognized as having a felony warrant. The male was arrested and booked. An officer conducted a bicycle stop on a male who was on probation and searchable. He was searched and found to have drugs on him. He was booked. An officer handled an aggressive dog call. He was attempting to drop the dog off at the animal shelter when the dog bit him. The officer spent the next couple hours at the ER getting treated and the dog showed no remorse.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Officers stopped a vehicle for speeding and a stop sign violation. Upon pulling over the driver quickly got out of the vehicle. He was quickly detained and several open beer cans were observed inside the vehicle. A DUI investigation was done and the driver was arrested with a BAC of .18%. Later in the shift an officer was flagged down by a witness who saw a female driver hit a railroad crossing guard and drive off. The vehicle was located parked on the side of the road nearby and the driver was located walking about a block away. She was identified by the witness and displayed signs of intoxication. She was ultimately arrested for DUI with a BAC of .15%, along with hit & run, and booked into jail. Officers also responded to a large family fight in front of a residence. A 17-year-old male had brandished a knife at his father after assaulting him twice. Family members held him down, but he was able to break free. He climbed on top of his father's car and kicked the windshield, breaking it. He then jumped on the roof of the car, causing dents. He was arrested for battery and vandalism, and booked into juvenile hall. Lastly, several officers responded to the 3rd story of a hotel for a male who was trying to kill himself by jumping out of the window. After breaking the glass, he was stopped by a friend who held him down until officers could get inside. The male was detained in handcuffs, but he continued to struggle and fight, taking 3 officers to hold him down. This all began after the male received a call from back home. He is from Montana and was in California for work. On the phone he was told that his wife and 1-month-old child were just killed in a car accident in front of their home. The male was

heavily intoxicated from tequila, and he was fueled with rage. He had to be sedated by AMR to calm him down, before he could be strapped to a gurney and transported to the hospital for a mental health evaluation hold.
