SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Today we had a full crew, which helped tremendously with responding to calls for service. We had a few calls that were extensive and required multiple officers to handle. Of note, the officers responded to a domestic violence in a residential home located on the west side of town. A wife was in an argument with her husband earlier in the night and she left. When she returned to try and get some belongings, she found the front door had been barricaded from the inside. She was able to push the door open and when she entered, her husband grabbed her and brought her inside the residence. A new argument started, and at one point the husband tried to grab her keys out of her hand. During the struggle, he caused an injury to her hand. She was able to get away, and then called TPD. When we arrived, the husband refused to open the door and then made suicidal text messages to the wife, while we were speaking with her. Officers tried to get the male to exit, but he would always refuse and then hang up the phone. In a last-ditch effort, we made contact via phone and informed him of an emergency restraining order that was issued, and that if he did not leave the home he would face additional charges. When the male saw that we were not going to go away, he decided to come outside and surrender himself. It was great teamwork from all officers involved, and the situation was ended peacefully, with no one getting hurt.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Officers investigated a violation of restraining order. The protected party reported her ex-boyfriend showed up at her residence uninvited. Officers tried to locate him at his last known residence but were unsuccessful. A warrant will be sought for his arrest for violating the order.
