They were able to have one party leave, in order to avoid any further incidents that might escalate.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Calls for service were steady all evening. SCU officers made a traffic stop and smelled alcohol on the male driver. When he was asked to step out of the vehicle, he put it in drive and took off. Officers pursued the vehicle for a few blocks until the occupants abandoned the car and fled on foot into a house. Both the driver and passenger were located and arrested. During the pursuit, a bottle of alcohol and loaded handgun were thrown out the window. The driver was booked for felony evading, and numerous gun charges. The passenger was booked for resisting arrest. Another traffic stop resulted in a male being arrested and booked for DUI. Officers investigated a hit & run downtown. While investigating, another officer spotted the suspect vehicle pulling into a driveway. The driver got out and tried to get into his house, but he was snatched up by the officer. He was DUI and positively identified as the hit & run suspect. He was arrested for both charges. Lastly, officers saved a life tonight by administering Narcan to a male who overdosed behind a dumpster and was unresponsive. He was given three doses to get him going again.
