SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Graveyards had a busy shift going into Easter Sunday. It started with a call involving a male victim who was stabbed multiple times by a male the victim did not know. The suspect was found nearby and had cuts on his hands that were bleeding. He had wrapped his hand in paper towels when officers located and detained him. He was also in possession of the knife believed to be used due to the blood on it. Detectives responded and the suspect confessed to the incident. The victim also identified in a photo line-up. At the time of this log, the victim was still at the hospital in serious but stable condition. Officers were dispatched to three different domestic violence calls last night involving battery. All three suspects were arrested and booked for their actions. Officers also responded to a hit & run collision. The suspect vehicle was located near the scene with the driver still in it. The driver was determined to be intoxicated and was arrested for DUI. In addition, we responded to assist Sheriff deputies on a call involving several subjects fighting in the front yard of a residence. We had the situation under control by the time the deputies arrived and took over the call.
