SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

A traffic stop was made for a simple equipment violation. The officer noticed signs of intoxication from the driver and FSTs were conducted. The driver performed poorly and had a BAC of .10%. He was arrested for DUI. Officers responded to a domestic disturbance call after the wife called to report her husband was drunk and acting violent. He was locked outside because of his behavior, so he began kicking in the back door. He was able to leave before police arrived and was not initially located. While officers were still on scene, he was eventually found hiding in the back seat of a vehicle parked in the driveway. He was heavily intoxicated and his family was afraid to allow him back inside in his condition. He was arrested for public intoxication and booked for sobering. About an hour later, an officer made a traffic stop for a missing front plate. The driver had a suspended license and was arrested. During a search he was found with a meth pipe and a bag of meth. After a search of the vehicle, officers found a loaded .9 mm handgun. The driver was not the legal owner of the gun, and did not have a concealed carry permit for the firearm. He was arrested and booked for several charges.
