### SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

It was a typical swing shift if there is one. This afternoon, an officer investigated an assault/battery where a group of 16-year-old boys drove recklessly past a group of 13-year-old girls walking home from school. They did this several times while throwing water bottles at them. At one point, a water bottle hit a girl on the leg causing a bruise. The officer tracked

down two of the suspects and arrested them for assault/battery. There are two more to locate. Next up was a domestic violence where a boyfriend punched his girlfriend in the face and slammed her foot in the door, causing injuries. He went to jail for felony domestic battery. We responded to a suicidal female who was in a bathroom and had cut her arms. She was detained for a mental health evaluation and transported by ambulance for treatment. The last highlight was a male who showed up uninvited to his family's home under the influence of drugs or alcohol. He was gone when officer arrived, but they located him a short time later. He conveniently had a felony warrant out of Merced County for violation of his probation. He was arrested and booked.
