During the day shift, the Turlock Police responded to various incidents, including multiple assaults and a robbery. There was an altercation at a local business that resulted in minor injuries, and another incident involved a physical fight in a residential area. Additionally, officers investigated a reported robbery in the north end of town that involved 2 students being the victims. 2 Mac Books were taken at that time. Overall, the shift involved handling a mix of violent and property-related crimes, reflecting a busy day for the department.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

This evening was quiet for a change, allowing officers to catch up on reports and case follow-ups. We had one traffic accident which was a bicyclist vs vehicle. The bicyclist took a spill but only sustained minor injuries. We also investigated an assault/battery where a male

and female victim had some words with two males exiting Kohls. A physical assault ensued and then the two males fled in a vehicle. Follow-up is being done to identify them. Other than that, we received a call of a brown cow missing from Hughson possibly headed toward Turlock. It didn't say whether he was headed here to shop or just to hang out, but we never did find him.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Calls allowed for officers to be proactive throughout the night. Two incidents highlight last night's shift, the first being an officer seeing a vehicle he recognized as being recently stolen earlier in the day. As he proceeded to get behind the vehicle, the driver pulled over and turned on the hazard lights. He was detained and provided a statement that did not match up with other details. He was also on PRCS for receiving stolen property. He was arrested for possession of a stolen vehicle and a Flash was authorized by probation; He was booked in jail. The second incident, another officer was at a red light behind a vehicle that was showing a hit for being stolen. Before trying to initiate a stop, the vehicle accelerated through the red light. After doing this, the vehicle stopped in the middle of the roadway and three occupants ran from it. A perimeter was established, a drone was used, and Air 101 responded to assist. The drone operator located a suspect, determined to be the driver, hiding in the backyard of a nearby residence. Officers quickly contained the area and after a short while, the suspect was seen trying to jump the fence and was confronted by several officers. He was taken into custody and determined to be on PRCS for possession of a stolen vehicle. On-call Probation was contacted authorized a Flash. Additionally, he was in possession of Meth and had two prior convictions involving narcotics. He was arrested and booked on three felony charges.
