SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Officers stayed busy all day but thankfully the calls were spaced out nicely. This morning a male was reportedly prowling around an apartment complex. He was located by officers and found to have warrants for his arrest for drug related charges. He was arrested and booked. A bit later, a male was stumbling drunk on Lander Ave, challenging people to a fight and throwing up gang signs. He was initially hesitant to comply with officers, but then made a wise decision and complied. He was arrested/booked for public intoxication. An officer made a traffic stop for a red-light violation. The driver lied about his name for about 15 minutes until the name game came to an end and he came clean. He had DUI priors, a suspended license for drunk driving and made matters worse by lying. He was arrested/booked for traffic charges and providing false ID to a peace officer. This afternoon, a male and female were eating their pizza from 711 in a vacant home for sale. Their lunch was interrupted by the homeowner arriving to check on the home. They fled on foot but were located and arrested by officers for trespassing.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Saturday night was very manageable. The heat is really keeping a lot of people inside air-conditioned areas. Today officers made 2 separate arrests for different issues. One was for a subject who was drunk in public and causing a disturbance. The second was for a stalking incident. The arrestee is restrained from the victim's home for a distance of 100 yards. He was served with the order, and since then he makes a point to park his car 150 yards from her home. He is currently homeless, so she sees him every day when she leaves her home. He has started to call her over 100 times, as well as yelling obscenities at her home when/if he drives past it. He has made threats to the victim, stating he will cause her bodily harm. The victim was afraid of the subject, and we were able to locate him. He was arrested for stalking, as well as a violation of the order.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

The shift seemed to pick up with calls as the night progressed. Officers still found time to make traffic stops that resulted in two arrests for DUI. The majority of the shift kept officers busy with a homicide investigation. During a party at an apartment complex an altercation occurred. During the incident a firearm was produced at some point and a male was shot in the chest area, leading to his death. The apparent suspect was still on scene and was detained. A loaded firearm was found on the ground nearby and recovered. Three males were detained in all and brought to the station to be interviewed by detectives. A search warrant was obtained for the apartment, and as of the time of this log the investigation was still ongoing.
