Dayshift spent half the day assisting with scene security at the homicide from last night. We also handled the transport of the suspect to jail. Otherwise, the calls for service were steady all day. One officer was on a prisoner watch all day at a hospital. An officer investigated a prior shoplift where the suspect was identified through surveillance video. The suspect was easily identified due to numerous prior contacts with officers. He is also on felony probation for theft related charges. He is now wanted for another one. At the end of shift, CHP located a stalking suspect from one of our prior cases that occurred a couple days ago. The investigating officer met with CHP to collect evidence and the suspect was booked.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Sunday turned out to be very busy. Officers started out by responding to a female yelling for help. She was seated in a vehicle in a cul-de-sac, and reporting parties stated that a male was smashing her windows with a wooden bat or large 2x4. When officers arrived, they located the female and noticed she was bleeding from a laceration to her forehead. The suspect was standing nearby and was arrested without incident. The windows of the car were almost all smashed out. The male was taken to jail for felony domestic battery. Later in the shift, a motorcycle was seen street racing a white corvette. The motorcycle turned to see the police car behind it, and when the traffic stop was initiated, the motorcycle sped off at a high rate of speed. A short pursuit was initiated, and the motorcycle was driving in a reckless manner. After a few minutes the motorcyclist yielded. The rider immediately jumped off the bike, threw his helmet off and was not listening to command by police officers. He started to place his hands into his pockets and was told not to. He continued to resist the officers and a canine was deployed to gain compliance. With the help of the canine, the subject was arrested for felony reckless driving, DWI, and resisting/obstructing police. He was medically cleared and booked into jail. Additionally, we responded to the location of the homicide a few times due to residents calling about large gatherings and fights. When police arrived on scene, everyone dispersed.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

The start of the shift was steady as officers responded to several disturbances involving intoxicated family members of the homicide victim from the night prior. An officer also contacted a male recognized as being wanted for a felony offense that occurred a few days prior. The male was arrested and booked. Officers responded to a possible auto-burglary in-progress at an apartment complex. The caller advised there was a male inside his truck who he did not know. When officers arrived, they found the male inside the vehicle passed out. He was removed from the truck, detained, and determined to be very intoxicated. He did not know where he was or how he got there. After determining that the vehicle was unlocked and nothing was stolen, the male was arrested and booked for public intoxication. Officers also responded to a vehicle collision after a male driver collided into a traffic light pole. The male showed signs of intoxication, performed poorly on the sobriety tests, and was arrested for DUI.
