SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

An officer contacted a group of people who were in a park after hours. One of the males was on parole and had a warrant for his arrest. A parole agent also placed a parole hold on the male. A female in the group also had a warrant and both were booked into jail. Officers responded to a vandalism in-progress. When officers arrived, they detained a male outside a residence. The male broke two windows to the house while trying to get inside. He also made criminal threats to the reporting party during the incident. He was arrested and booked. Several officers responded to a hit and run where the victim was chasing after the suspect vehicle. The suspect vehicle eventually collided into a traffic light pole, which caused the power to go out in the whole intersection. The male left the scene on foot but later returned while officers were still on scene. He was arrested for the hit and run, and for driving without a license. An officer also saw a male he recognized and knew to have a felony warrant. The warrant was for failure to register as a sex offender. The male was also out of compliance with sex offender registration; He was taken to jail.
