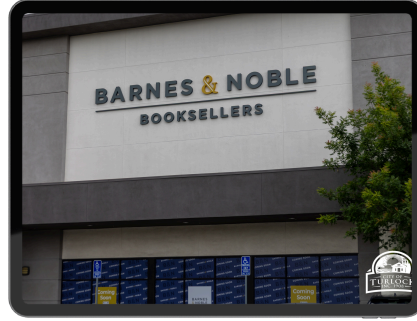
Key Highlights

- Completed 16 Business Retention & Expansion meetings and 20 Business Attraction meetings during May, bringing the fiscal year total to 260 business engagement meetings.
- Celebrated National Small Business Week by conducting local business outreach and promoting the importance of shopping local to support jobs, families, and essential City services.
- Continued supporting business growth and investment with multiple businesses preparing to open in Turlock, including Barnes & Noble, Cla-Val Company, Wicked UTV, Tequileros Taqueria, Espressito Café & Bakery, Chick-fil-A, and others.
- Represented the City of Turlock at Beam Circular’s BioCatalyst: Industry & Innovation Exchange, promoting Turlock’s competitive advantages while building relationships with emerging companies, entrepreneurs, investors, and industry leaders in the growing bioeconomy sector.

Summary:

Turlock continued to experience strong economic activity during May 2026, with 36 business engagement meetings completed, multiple new businesses preparing to open, continued investment in infrastructure and workforce development initiatives, and active participation in regional business attraction efforts. Staff focused on supporting existing businesses, promoting entrepreneurship, advancing business recruitment opportunities, and positioning Turlock for long-term economic growth through strategic partnerships and community investment.

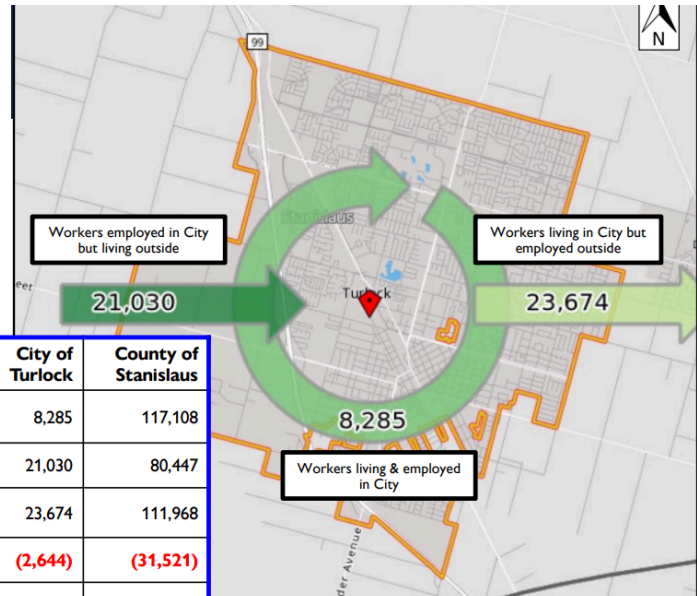

Business Retention and Expansion (BRE) plays a vital role in economic development by prioritizing the needs of existing businesses within the City. These businesses serve as the backbone of the local economy, driving job creation and economic resilience.

Through proactive engagement and support, BRE initiatives help businesses address challenges, capitalize on growth opportunities, and remain competitive, ultimately reinforcing the City's economic stability and reducing the likelihood of business closures.

During the month of May 2026, City of Turlock Economic Development staff completed 16 Business Retention and Expansion meetings, as well as completed 20 Business Attraction meetings.

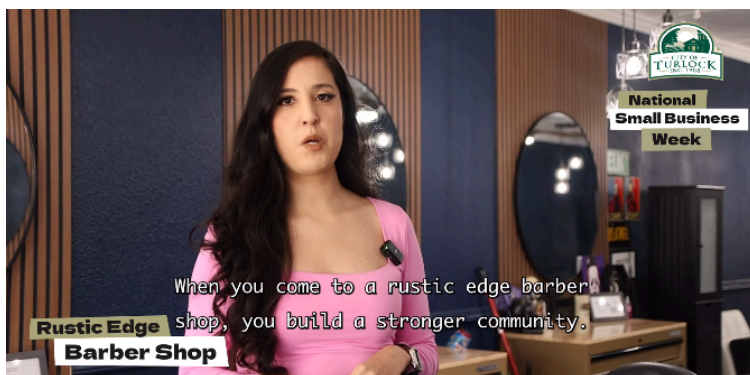
National Small Business Week - May 2026

In recognition of National Small Business Week (May 3–9, 2026), Economic Development staff conducted outreach by visiting local businesses and promoting the importance of shopping local throughout the community. Small businesses represent over 90% of all businesses in the United States and serve as a critical foundation of Turlock’s local economy.

Economic Development staff regularly meet with local businesses throughout the year and understand the critical importance of supporting and shopping local. In advance of and during National Small Business Week, staff increased engagement with local businesses to collaborate on messaging and raise awareness of the importance of shopping local and supporting local families.

Supporting local businesses not only strengthens small business owners and their families, but also generates sales tax revenue that helps fund essential City services, including public safety, infrastructure improvements, and roadway projects. Local businesses play a vital role in job creation, community identity, and overall quality of life in Turlock.

Overall, National Small Business Week served as an opportunity to reinforce the importance of small businesses and the City’s ongoing commitment to supporting their success.





Attraction strategies within economic development are designed to draw new businesses, industries, and investments to a region. These strategies typically involve a combination of marketing, incentives, infrastructure development, and partnership-building to create a compelling case for businesses to relocate or expand.

Turlock offers a strategic location along the Highway 99 corridor with high visibility and access to over 640,000 people within a 20-mile radius, making it an ideal place for business growth. The City supports new investment through its Development Incentive Program, including a 25% reduction in Capital Facilities Fees, along with streamlined processes like no-cost pre-development meetings.

Businesses benefit from a strong regional workforce, competitive utility rates through Turlock Irrigation District, and a diverse economy that includes retail, manufacturing, logistics, and agriculture.

Turlock is also home to major employers and a thriving retail environment, including the Monte Vista Crossings Power Center and CSU Stanislaus. With available development sites and a business-friendly approach, Turlock provides the resources and opportunities needed for businesses to start, expand, and succeed.

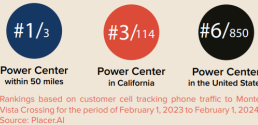

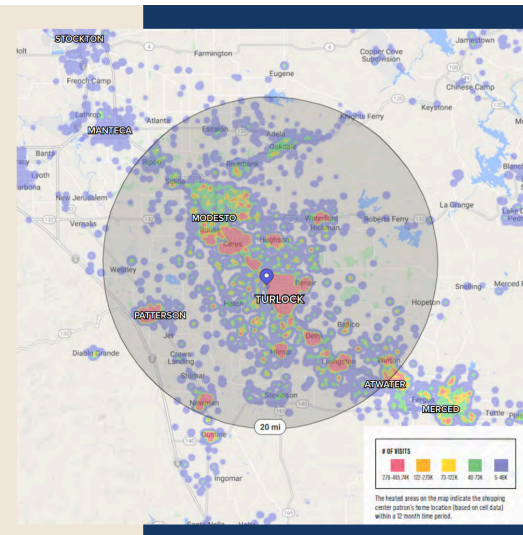

The Stanislaus Regional Water Authority (SRWA) project helps diversify Turlock's water portfolio and strengthen long-term water reliability for residential, commercial, and industrial growth. Reliable water infrastructure is often a key consideration for manufacturers, technology companies, healthcare providers, and other major employers evaluating expansion opportunities.

Ongoing roadway improvements throughout the city help improve safety, mobility, connectivity, and access for residents, visitors, and businesses while supporting future development opportunities.

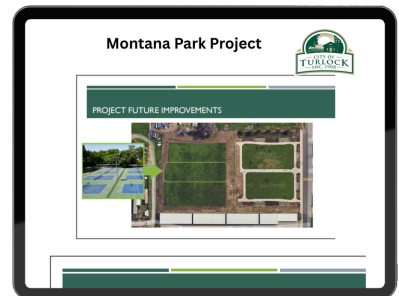
Parks & Quality of Life

Business Attraction

Housing growth and economic development go hand in hand.

A current residential project in Turlock will bring approximately 114 new housing units to our community, and those rooftops matter. The video showcases residential projects located at 1601 W. Monte Vista Avenue and 3201 Four Seasons Drive in Turlock, CA.

In economic development, housing unit counts are one of the key metrics companies evaluate when deciding where to invest, expand, and create jobs. Retailers and entertainment concepts like Trader Joe's and Topgolf often analyze household density, population growth, and consumer spending patterns within specific trade areas before selecting locations.

It's not just retail, advanced manufacturers, technology companies, medical offices, and other employers also look closely at housing availability and community growth when determining where to locate and recruit talent.

More housing means more families living, shopping, dining, and investing in our local economy. Increased consumer activity helps generate sales tax revenue that can support future investments in roads, infrastructure, parks, public safety, and other quality-of-life improvements throughout our community.

Strategic growth helps position Turlock for long-term economic success, future amenities, expanded job opportunities, and continued private investment. Projects like this help lay the foundation for future economic growth and a stronger community for generations to come.





Business Attraction

Turlock Partnership Incentive Program

This program is designed to:

- Support small businesses opening in Turlock
- Help revitalize vacant storefronts
- Create new jobs in our community

To qualify, businesses must:

- Open in an existing vacant building within city limits
 - Provide a business plan (with no-cost support available through the Valley Sierra SBDC)
 - Attend a no-cost pre-development meeting
 - Agree to simple record-keeping for one year
 - Not be part of a franchise, nonprofit, or corporate chain
- *Grant application must be submitted prior to starting the licensing and permitting process.**

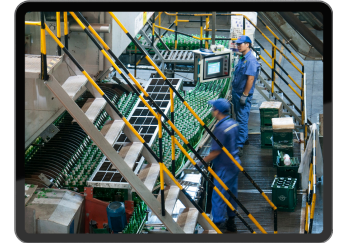

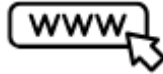
