1. ACTION RECOMMENDED:

Motion:

Receiving applications for the Council vacancy for District 4 and

providing direction to staff regarding the interview and selection

process for filling the vacancy

2. SYNOPSIS:

The City Council will receive applications for the Council seat vacancy for District 4 and provide direction to staff regarding the interview and selection process for filling the vacancy.

3. DISCUSSION OF ISSUE:

On November 6, 2018, District 4 Council Member Amy Bublak was elected Mayor of the City of Turlock. This has created a vacancy in the position of District 4 Council Member for the remainder of the term expiring in November 2020.

California Government Code section 36512(b) requires the City Council, within sixty (60) days from the commencement of the vacancy, to either fill the vacancy by appointment or call a special election to fill the vacancy.

There are no state laws or Turlock Municipal Code provisions establishing specific procedures to make an appointment. No formal application process is required, and the City Council may appoint any eligible person to the vacancy.

The City Council may fill any vacant elective office in the City, including a vacant Council seat, by appointment. The only requirement is that the person appointed must be eligible to hold office. A person is eligible to hold office as a Council Member only if he or she is an elector of the City and a registered voter. An elector of the City is a United States citizen, eighteen (18) years of age or older, who is a resident of the City.

Turlock Municipal Code section 2-1-06 also requires that, "all persons appointed to fill vacancies on the City Council and all persons elected to fill vacancies on the City Council at a special municipal election shall reside within the district to which they are appointed or elected."

The appointment of a new Council Member requires the vote of a majority of a quorum at a properly noticed meeting.

On December 11, 2018, at their regularly scheduled meeting, the City Council voted to fill the vacancy by appointment and solicit applications from interested citizens desiring to fill this vacancy and serve the community in this capacity. The Council also established an application filing deadline of January 7, 2019 at 5:00 p.m. and directed staff to transmit to the Council, no later than January 8, 2019, any applications received by the filing deadline.

Following receipt of the applications, the City Council will provide direction regarding the selection of applicants to interview and may consider one of the following options and/or provide additional feedback for conducting the interview process.

- 1. Call a special meeting to interview applicants and make an appointment to fill the vacancy at that same meeting.
- Call a special meeting to interview applicants and make an appointment to fill the vacancy at the next regularly scheduled meeting or at a special meeting date to be identified.

4. BASIS FOR RECOMMENDATION:

- A. The City Council seat for District 4 has become vacant due to District 4 Council Member Amy Bublak being sworn in as the newly elected Mayor on December 11, 2018.
- B. Pursuant to California Government Code section 36512(b), the City Council, within sixty (60) days from the commencement of the vacancy, is required to either fill the vacancy by appointment or call a special election to fill the vacancy.

5. FISCAL IMPACT / BUDGET AMENDMENT:

There will be minimal costs associated with an appointment process to fill the vacancy. No budget amendment would be needed.

6. CITY MANAGER'S COMMENTS:

The City Manager will follow direction as provided by the City Council.

What are your most important skills and qualifications you would offer as a member of the Council? For example, skills you possess to work effectively with the City Council, City Manager, City Attorney, and Community Members.

As there are over 9,500 seniors in Turlock, I believe they need a "voice" in city decisions. I am well-read, am tech savvy, and follow issues significant in our community. I understand how local, state and national government entities work and have navigated through various government offices helping people solve problems and issues. I work well with a diverse group of people and work hard to bring consensus. I am a good listener, and if I do not understand something, I ask questions.

What are the most important issues facing Turlock today?

The increase in homeless men, women, and families coupled with the lack of adequate affordable housing is one of the main issues facing the city of Turlock. I have interacted and served meals to some of our homeless men in Turlock, many who are struggling with mental health and addiction issues. One solution I have is to partner with the Stanislaus County Fairgrounds and Stanislaus County to provide an area of the Fairgrounds for the homeless men and women and their pets to stay overnight and store their belongings. The facility/area would need 24 hour security, and already has showers and restrooms, maybe using the animals barns for shelter. Obviously we would not be able to use this during events or the Stanislaus County Fair but it could be a temporary solution until a more permanent one is found.

I have concerns about the City of Turlock's budget and making sure we can pay our bills. We also need to build back up the city's reserve fund. We need to look at alternative ideas of how to generate income for the city of Turlock.

I would like to see the many potholes across town, especially the main arteries. I would like to direct staff to make it a priority to fix major potholes.

Lastly, the number of affordable senior housing units is minimal. If possible, we need to look at different ways to bring more affordable housing to Turlock. Affordable housing is not only a senior, but an everybody issue in Turlock.



Consequently, neighboring cities have seen a surge in companies joining their ranks, and with that, more jobs and a larger general fund via sales tax. With the nation's economy booming and money changing hands everywhere, it is imperative that Turlock make effort to claim its piece of the pie.





A-I believe disagreement in government is necessary to develop consensus. Only by working with community leaders, business owners, religious leaders, and educators, will the problems facing Turlock be solved. New methods to old problems must be developed. Tough decisions impacting future generations should be made in a collaborative, transparent, and meaningful way. The demands of the 21st century require well-trained and well-educated leaders. My work experience as a probation officer coupled with my education allows me to to think and see things differently and adapt to the uniqueness of Turlock. Leaders must be able to leverage data and technology and develop strategies which will lead to lasting change.

Q-What are the most important issues facing Turlock today?

A-The two greatest issues current facing Turlock today are the homeless crisis and ensuring government spends taxpayer money wisely. I am currently working as the manager of the multi-agency Community Assessment and Response Engagement (CARE) multi-disciplinary team (MDT) task force. This task force was developed to address the homeless issue in downtown Modesto. As part of the executive work group, I participated and provided valuable input during table top exercise where mental health services were assessed and matched to individuals in crisis or in need of community or government provided services. The homeless problem in Turlock is not going away. The Council needs a member who understands and has experience navigating and leveraging health care, mental health, and criminal justice services to address homeless issue facing the City of Turlock. This year I was re-elected to another term as a trustee on the Stanislaus County Employees Retirement Association. As a trustee of a public funded pension plan, I am responsible for investment decisions and asset allocations of the fund. To meet my fiduciary responsibility, I expand my base of knowledge through regular training and seminars. While I am not responsible for setting benefits, my role as trustee gives me greater understanding of the relationship between the City, employee labor groups, and negative fiscal impact of poor negotiations and agreements.



Question #4

Throughout my years of working for 2 public agencies I had to develop the skills to lead and also listen to our constituents needs and wants. I learned that there is always more than one solution. Working with multiple agencies is a must. You must learn to identity the nature of the problem and figure out what agencies would expedite the answer necessary. Whether that is the City Manager office, City Council or any outside agencies, commitment to the community and to our government is critical.

Problem solving takes a lot of listening. If you don't have an answer one must to willing to find one. Tack and diplomacy is also mandatory when dealing with the public. These are skills that I had to develop in order to complete my jobs at the time.

Working with the public has probably been the most challenging but the most rewarding.

Skills

In the Beginning of my career while working at the Stanislaus Board of Supervisors I had the opportunity to work with 29 different agencies with-in the county and well as the City of Modesto since we were all in the same building.

I collaborated with the County CEO and the City Managers of all counties in California because my Boss as the time was on the Board of the CSAC (California State Association of Counties). I was involved with LAFCO, the Planning Commission, County Council and as well StanCO. (Stanislaus Council of Governments).

I would attend 20-35 community meetings a week to discuss upcoming events in the county as well as updated on policy and procedures for upcoming meeting.

I was also a trained facilitator for the County and would coordinate community and housing meeting for District 3.

Working for the United States Congress, I had a slighting different role as I was still dealing constituents but had a more active role with policy and decision making within our district. We worked with all Councils, County Government and State Officials to bring programs to the State of California. Whether that was Water, Ag Programs, Immigration issues, or Transportation issues, I was involved in the initial legislative processes.

Important Issues Facing Turlock Today......

The most important item that I can be helpful with regards to the issues are in the area of transportation, water and business development and retention, community relations. I have been given opportunities to learn about programs and projects that could benefit Turlock for the long run.

As most city's and counties have issues with a homeless population, I think this a collaborative issues that needs to be worked on with the State and the Federal Government. It's a national crisis, not just a Turlock Crisis.

Budgetary and staffing issues are of course a concern. We need to focus on long term planning. A 2-3 year vision, 10-15 year and a 30 year. Guidelines for the future.


