## SPECIAL DEPLOYMENT EFFORTS:

1. Rape Aggression Defense (RAD) Course—A 2-day self defense course was provided for citizens in collaboration with CSUS police department.
2. Recruitment Event, September 8, 2018—The Recruitment Team hosted it's first recruitment event at the police department. There was a large group of interested applicants that attended.
3. Coffee with the Chief, September 29, 2018—Chief Amirfar hosted another Coffee with the Chief event. This event is open to the community to come and address any questions or concerns they have about Turlock directly with the Chief of Police.
4. Downtown Extra Patrol Shifts are a non-mandatable, voluntary overtime detail. Officers that sign up are tasked with providing extra patrols of the downtown area and city parks nearby. Officers are to conduct patrol on foot, bike or Trikke. Officers are encouraged to conduct outreach with business owners, network and collaborate with them to address CTO's, illegal nuisance behaviors and other criminal violations by applying the Community Oriented Policing philosophy. Officers are encouraged to sign up to work for two to four (2-4) hour shifts anytime between 0700-1700 hours, Monday through Friday. During the month of August, 7 extra shifts were worked.

## ANIMAL SERVICES & PET OF THE MONTH:

1. Officers visited 66 residents for pet license enforcement during the month of September.

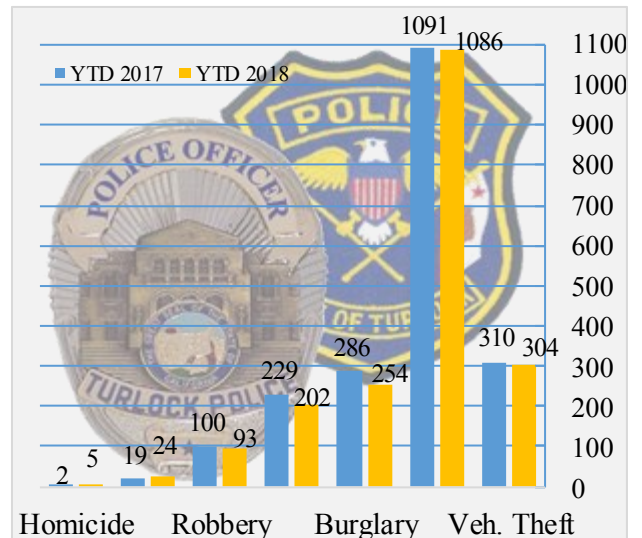

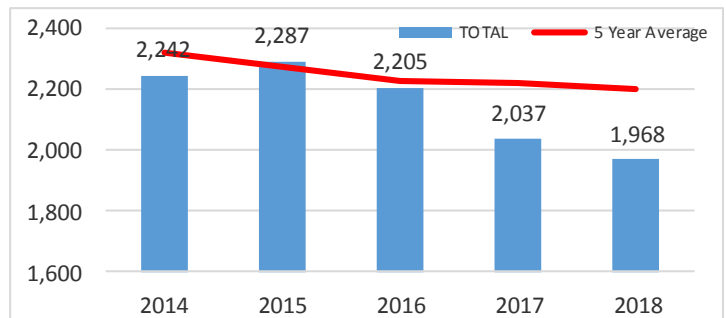

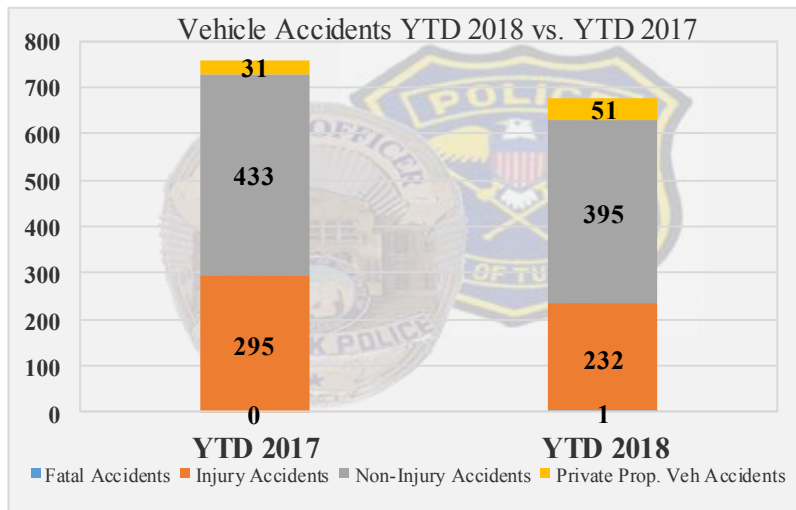
