  - Receive project update and consider moving forward with the Stanislaus Regional Water Authority's (SRWA) Regional Surface Water Supply Project (RSWSP)
  - Review and consider interim financing alternatives to meet the financial obligations of the Stanislaus Regional Water Authority's Regional Surface Water Supply Project until the approved State Revolving Funds are received in 2021

City Manager Toby Wells introduced City of Modesto Director of Utilities Will Wong who presented information regarding a potential regional surface water project with the City of Modesto, Modesto Irrigation District, and the City of Turlock, including two options for City participation with estimated cost projections for each.

Council and staff discussed the City of Modesto proposal, including the level of risk associated with the project, obtaining a water rights agreement with the Modesto Irrigation District and the Turlock Irrigation District, rehabilitation costs for capital projects, the growth rate of partner cities, and the project timeline.

City Manager Toby Wells introduced SRWA General Manager Bob Granberg who presented information regarding the City of Modesto/Modesto Irrigation District proposal draft costs as compared to the SRWA project costs, the permitting process timeline and approvals needed from state and regional boards for the City of Modesto/Modesto Irrigation District proposed project. Mr. Granberg further presented a cost update for the SRWA Regional Surface Water Supply Project including grants received and additional savings realized, and the current status of the various project elements such as the wet well construction, the water rights protest, the design-build contract award, the State Revolving Fund (SRF) loan agreement, construction of the RSWSP, and the estimated completion date.

Council and staff discussed the SRWA project, including the status of current and future grants, water quality standards, the cost comparison of the City of Modesto/Modesto Irrigation District proposal and the SRWA project, the SRF loan, the project timeline, the status of Turlock's drinking water wells, and the possible participation of additional agencies in the Project.

City Manager Toby Wells introduced SRWA Finance Director Marie Lorenzi who presented information regarding the interim financing alternatives to meet the financial obligations of the SRWA RSWSP until the approved SRF monies are received in 2021, including the use of a Bond Anticipation Note (BAN), or the issuance of a revenue bond.

Council and staff discussed the interim financial alternatives, including the reserves available in the City's water fund for local improvements and the terminal storage tank, and potential grant opportunities.
